

# 10th Tuna Data Workshop

## RECOMMENDATIONS

---

1. The workshop acknowledged the importance, benefits and progress that **DATA SHARING** provided member countries and recommended that:
  - a. FFA and SPC continue to facilitate and encourage member countries to ratify the data sharing arrangements in the Niue Treaty Subsidiary Agreement (NTSA) as soon as possible;
  - b. Data Managers of member countries that have yet to ratify the NTSA, actively advise their senior managers of the benefits of data sharing;
2. The workshop recommended that SPC FAME (OFP and CFP) continue to progress approaches for the **integration of artisanal fisheries data collection systems** and database systems that can be used by member countries.
3. The workshop participants recommended a number of specific requests for enhancements to the IMS systems maintained by SPC and FFA, including:
  - a. Redeveloping and enhance the current TUFMAN1 Licensing Reports in the National IMS, which would include:
    - A set of reports that can integrate licensing and logsheet data;
    - Reports on the reconciliation of license fees with licenses in the IMS;
    - A new facility that generates an invoice-like document to request payments from fishing companies
  - b. Detailed recommendations listed in the Tufman 2 group report (see appendix)
4. Improve the information on reports within the Dorado reports for:
  - a. Data sources
  - b. Raised and unraised data
