What is the issue?

- Delay with the submission of observer Gen-3 reports and other IUU reports;
- ☐ Flag states and coastal states not receiving the reports regarding Gen-3 issues in a timely manner;
- Critical Incident Reports (CIR) against a vessel not investigated;
- CCMs labelled as not compliant to WCPFC-CMS process or; Part 2



Options to address the issue?

- Dedicated personnel to analyse Gen-3;
- Provide critical incident analysis training to dedicated personnel;
- Near real time reporting using e-Reporting;
- Understanding MCS data access processes;
- Understanding information confidentiality and different Data Rules and access requirements;
- Building strong networking between observer providers, Flag CCMs, Coastal states, Port States and relevant authorised officers etc;




When do deal with the issue

- □ As quickly as possible after the pre-debriefing and or full debriefing processes that flagged any alleged violation;
- ☐ Investigate when vessel is still in port of arrival;
- Notify flag state if the vessel enters a port outside of the FFA region;
- Provide alleged infringement report to Flag CCMs




WCPFC Pre-Notification Process for alleged infringement reports by Observer Providers to Flag States





National level Gen – 3 Data Flow





 Dedicated personnel is required at the NOPs in order to effectively analyze Gen – 3 reports;

Critical incident report will be submitted to the concern parties in a timely manner;

Alleged infringement investigated and actions taken reported;
