

# What is the link between the TDW and the WCPFC? • TDW sup



TDW supports national fishery data management and assists countries with the development of national Annual Catch and Effort (ACE) Tables

ACE estimates help to check Scientific Data submissions & form part of WCPFC annual reporting

 WCPFC is the tuna RFMO that is responsible for conservation management of highly migratory fish stocks in the WCPO

26 Member countries sit as the governing body of WCPFC and collectively take decisions

Conservation and management measures specify fishery rules including *inter alia* quantitative fishery limits, MCS measures and reporting requirements



# **Compliance Monitoring Scheme (CMS)**

Purpose & Guiding Principles






To ensure that CCMs implement and comply with obligations arising under the Convention and Conservation and Management Measures adopted by the Commission.



...and also to assess flag CCM action in relation to alleged violations by its vessels, not to assess compliance by individual vessels.



# **AR Part 2 Reporting**



### Reporting on Quantitative Limits

- CCMs should include in annual reports supporting details that confirm a quantitative limit was not exceeded
- If a CCM is not subject to a limit and is fully meets obligation to provide data, they shouldn't have to provide reports related to monitoring implementation of limits



### Reporting on Implementation—type obligations

- Legislation and regulations don't change very often
- Prior year statements of implementation should be able to be reconfirmed in future Annual Reports (rather than need to be repeated verbatim each year)



 established templates and standards and where available online direct-entry and/or electronic reporting IT solutions should be used to assist CCMs and the Secretariat in managing these reports


### AR Pt2 (Prior year obligations)

Has been pre-populated with CCM responses submitted from RY2018 about implementation of obligations that applied previously

### AR Pt2 (2019 Specific)

Contains specific reporting requirements for RY2019, including reporting on new obligations that applied for first time in RY2019

- Implementation new obligations introduced in 2019
- Quantitative limits
- Reporting checklist
- Required report: CMM 2013-07 para 19
- Required reports: MCS, compliance and fishing activities





# Streamlining annual reporting

(Discussion paper: TCC15-2019-10)

# Reporting related to Scientific Data and Annual Report Part 1

Some key points:

- Operational level catch and effort data submissions have improved
  - If a CCM is fully meeting their obligation to submit operational data, it should be possible for SPC-OFP with input from the relevant CCMs to prepare and publish summary tables of essential fisheries information and annual catch estimates based on these scientific data submissions
  - The reporting requirements to include ACE tables in Annual Report Part 1 is potentially duplicative
- Review Annual Report Part 1 reporting requirements
  - Should some reports in the Addendum be reclassified as annual reports on the implementation of CMM?
    - Consider submit in AR Pt2, but maintain classification as public domain data?
  - Should Annual Report Part 1 be made voluntary?





### **North Pacific Albacore**

(CMM 2019-03 para 3)

3. All CCMs shall report annually to the WCPFC Commission all catches of albacore north of the equator and all fishing effort north of the equator in fisheries directed at albacore. The reports for both catch and fishing effort shall be made by gear type. Catches shall be reported in terms of weight. Fishing effort shall be reported in terms of the most relevant measures for a given gear type, including at a minimum for all gear types, the number of vessel-days fished, using the template provided in **Annex 1**.
