Core Duty of a Debriefer

- Check for accuracy, completeness, reliable and unbiased data;
- Check for alleged infringement that may require an investigation;
- Analyze and compile necessary documentation surrounding the matter for the next course of action to be taken by the appropriate officer;
- □ Inform the observer coordinator and the concern observer of outcome of the debriefing;
- Work in collaboration with Compliance Officers;



Preferred Essential Knowledge & Skills

- Experience observer background;
- Strong knowledge and understanding of all observer data fields;
- ☐ Knowing the fishery; (LL,PS, PL,PT,MS)
- Ability to conduct effective Interview techniques and provide constructive feedback;
- Ability to communicate effectively during debriefing;



Advance Knowledge & Skills

- Understanding of the National Fisheries Act/Regulation;
- Understanding of the Regional Access Arrangements/Agreements; (FSMA, UST);
- Understanding the bilateral access agreements;
- Understanding the WCPFC-ROP pre-notification process and requirements;
- Ability to carry out Critical Analysis
- Ability to write legal statement;
- Ability to compile relevant evidence
- Ability to prepare case brief;



COMPETENCY

A person is **NOT** competent unless they have:

Knowledge + Skills + ATTITUDE = Competence
